Introduction to theme

This scientific symposium highlights the latest advances in transplantation, regenerative medicine, and bioengineering. The programme explores innovative strategies to improve transplant outcomes, including immune tolerance induction, cell-based therapies, organ engineering, epigenetic editing, and machine perfusion technologies.

Participants will gain insight into emerging approaches for organ repair and regeneration, targeted drug and cell delivery, senolytic therapies, and novel methods to reduce graft immunogenicity. By bringing together cutting-edge developments from both basic science and clinical research, the symposium provides healthcare professionals with an overview of future directions in transplantation medicine and regenerative therapies.

Inleiding tot thema

Dit wetenschappelijk symposium belicht de nieuwste ontwikkelingen binnen transplantatiegeneeskunde, regeneratieve geneeskunde en bio-engineering. Het programma richt zich op innovatieve strategieën om transplantatie-uitkomsten te verbeteren, waaronder immuuntolerantie-inductie, celtherapieën, orgaanengineering, epigenetische modificatie en machineperfusietechnologieën.

Deelnemers krijgen inzicht in nieuwe benaderingen voor orgaanherstel en -regeneratie, gerichte toediening van geneesmiddelen en cellen tijdens perfusie, senolytische therapieën en innovatieve methoden om de immunogeniciteit van donororganen te verminderen. Door baanbrekende ontwikkelingen uit zowel fundamenteel als klinisch onderzoek samen te brengen, biedt het symposium zorgprofessionals een actueel overzicht van toekomstige richtingen binnen de transplantatiegeneeskunde en regeneratieve therapieën.
